

Myron Uhlberg's "moving memoir" (*Booklist*), **HANDS OF MY FATHER: A Hearing Boy, His Deaf Parents, and the Language of Love**, is a unique and beautifully told coming-of-age story. Capturing the emotional complexities of being a child in a position few of us can imagine, it tells how from a very young age Uhlberg had to take on responsibilities that were far beyond his years. As he performed the delicate balancing act of mediating between his father and the hearing world, he was required to reverse the roles of parent and child translating adult words and concepts to his father at one moment, while at the next reverting to just what he was: his father's little boy. Called "a well-crafted, heartwarming tale of family love and understanding" by *Publishers Weekly*, **HANDS OF MY FATHER** will be published as a Bantam Books Hardcover on sale February 3, 2009.

Born in Brooklyn at the absolute bottom of the Great Depression, Uhlberg was the son of two people who shared a boundless optimism about the future. His first language was American Sign Language (ALS), but his second language was spoken English, and no sooner did he learn it than he was called upon to act as his father's designated ears and mouth in the stores and streets beyond their silent apartment. Because of his role-straddling situation, he was a pint-sized witness to many of the key moments of his historic era. Listening to the radio he had to sign for his father every blow in what was called the "fight of the century," the boxing match between America's Brown Bomber Joe Louis and Hitler's Master Race champion Max Schmeling. While his father, in turn, signed to him his own translations of the newspaper headlines trumpeting every battle on the European and Pacific fronts, so that he watched the progress of the war through the medium of his father's hands.

Eloquent, touching and often funny as well, Uhlberg's "memories have been beautifully served...in this heartfelt book" (*Booklist*). **HANDS OF MY FATHER** is a timeless story that is both unique and universal.
